

Proposed works under Tuen Mun river beautification scheme gazetted

The Government published a Gazette notice today (May 20) on the proposed works under the Tuen Mun river beautification scheme. The proposed works aim at building a landmark at Tuen Mun River for touring and sightseeing.

The proposed works are as follows:

- (a) construction of a footbridge approximately 85 metres in length with associated ramps and stairs across Tuen Mun River between Tin Hau Road and Tuen Mun Park;
- (b) temporary closure and reconstruction of sections of the existing cycle path and footpath along Tin Hau Road; a section of the existing amenity area, including cycle path and footpath, inside Tuen Mun Park; and a section of the existing Tuen Mun River Channel; and
- (c) ancillary works including civil, geotechnical, landscaping, water and drainage works and street lighting.
