

**Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370)**

**Scheme annexed to Plans Nos. 60700410/GZ/000 to 60700410/GZ/003  
under section 5 describing**

**Drainage Improvement Works at She Shan, Tai Po, New Territories –  
Ancillary Road Works**

**General Description of the Works**

Under powers delegated by the Secretary for Transport and Logistics under section 3(3) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370) (“the Ordinance”), the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Logistics proposes to execute the road works within the limit of works area as shown on Plans Nos. 60700410/GZ/000 to 60700410/GZ/003 (“the Plans”) annexed hereto and described hereunder. The proposed road works are required to improve the drainage system at She Shan in Tai Po.

2. The general nature of the proposed works is as follows:–

- (i) construction of access roads, a vehicular cum pedestrian bridge and a footbridge;
- (ii) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing access roads into footpaths;
- (iii) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing footpaths into access roads, footbridges and a run-in/run-out;
- (iv) permanent closure and conversion of a section of the existing vehicular cum pedestrian bridge into a footbridge;
- (v) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing footbridge into an access road and a footpath;
- (vi) permanent closure and demolition of sections of the existing footpaths;

- (vii) permanent closure and demolition of a section of the existing vehicular cum pedestrian bridge;
- (viii) temporary closure and reconstruction of sections of the existing access roads, footpaths, footbridges and run-in/run-out; and
- (ix) ancillary works including drainage, water, electrical and mechanical, public lighting, utilities and amenity works.

#### Land to be Resumed

3. For the purposes of or incidental to the works or the use, the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Logistics proposes that powers under section 13 of the Ordinance may be exercised to resume the land as shown on Resumption Plan No. TPM6973a annexed hereto and detailed in the table set out thereon. Further notice, setting out the manner in which the land is to be resumed, will be issued under section 14 of the Ordinance as and when required.

#### Roads to be Closed

4. For the purposes of or incidental to the works or the use, the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Logistics proposes that powers under section 17 of the Ordinance may be exercised to close permanently sections of the existing access roads, footpaths, vehicular cum pedestrian bridge and footbridge; and to close temporarily sections of the existing access roads, footpaths, vehicular cum pedestrian bridge, footbridges and run-in/run-out within the limit of works area as shown on the Plans. Temporary alternative access will be provided and temporary diversions will be carried out during the construction period as and when required. Further notice, setting out the manner in which such access roads, footpaths, vehicular cum pedestrian bridge, footbridges and run-in/run-out are to be closed, will be issued under section 18 of the Ordinance as and when required.

Apparatus whose Course or Position to be Altered

5. For the purposes of or incidental to the works or the use, the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Logistics proposes that powers under section 20 of the Ordinance may be exercised to require alteration of the course or position of any gas, electricity, water or telecommunications service apparatus, such as electricity cables and ducts, telecommunication cables and ducts, water mains, drainage pipes, gas pipes and any other apparatus lying within the limit of works area, and to require repairing of any road surface thereby disturbed. Further notice, setting out the manner in which the course or position of such apparatus is to be altered and such road surface is to be repaired, will be issued under section 20 of the Ordinance as and when required.
